INTERNSHIP PROGRAM INFORMATION

Sisters of Color Ending Sexual Assault (SCESA) was born out of a desire for Women of Color in the anti-sexual assault movement across the country to reclaim our leadership and ensure inclusion of our experiences in ending sexual assault. SCESA believes sexual assault is a symptom of a larger problem that reinforces an environment which allows violence to exist and a society that has deemed some people as less deserving. Therefore, SCESA's overall fundamental principal is to give voice and develop action strategies that incorporate and address the multiple layers of discrimination that are faced by Women of Color and Communities of Color.

Internship Positions Available: SCESA offers several internship positions every semester:

The Communication Intern assists with social media, newsletter writing, basic administrative, and research.

The Policy/ Advocacy Intern assists with research and reporting on policy meetings and potential host organizations. Assisted with web-based research, compilation and analysis of data and data trends, and support for policy events.

The Website Design Intern maintain organizational newsletters and website, develop strategies for ongoing marketing from non-profit realm, craft in developing potential digital graphic for organizational use, and continue dialogue with supervisor on retrospective marketing ideas to create an effective awareness tier while considering guideline.

Eligibility: A candidate must be a graduate or undergraduate student and have a:

Demonstrated interest and commitment to working on Communities of Color and Women's rights issues Oral and written communication skills

Self-motivator to work in Virtual Office.

Commitment to work for a minimum of 12 weeks

General Information: Interns are expected to work between 15 and 20 hours a week for a minimum of 12 weeks. Internship term start and end dates are flexible and may work around intern's schedule. Internships are offered during the Summer, Fall, and Winter/Spring semesters. All internships are generally unpaid. Interns may receive academic credit if an agreement is made between SCESA and the intern's college or university.

SCESA is interested in supporting the leadership of Women of Color. We will work with all majors. We have unpaid internships. If you are interested in learning, we are interested in you! SCESA is an advocacy organization. We provide training, education and address national policy impacting on Women and Communities of Color. We do not provide direct services to victims of sexual assault.

Application Procedures: Candidates must complete an application form and submit it with their cover letter, a short writing sample and resume. All application items must be submitted as a complete package. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed. Telephone interviews will be scheduled for finalists.

Application Deadlines: For the Summer program, applications are due by May 15; for the Fall program, applications are due by August 15; and for the Winter/Spring program, applications are due by December 15.
